About the college

Guru Nanak College, affiliated to Punjabi University, Patiala (listed in 12(b) & 2(f) sections of UGC Act 1956) is situated on the outskirts of Budhlada- a small town of a district Mansa in Punjab. To pay tribute to the 500th birth anniversary of "Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji", it was started in 1971 by some eminent personalities of this region keeping in mind the noble cause of making affordable education accessible to all the people of this backward, rural and remote area. In the beginning, it was functioning under the local management but later on handed over to the SGPC (Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee, Sri Amritsar Sahib)- an apex and philanthropic body of the Sikhs that is committed to serving people, on 09 November 1994 due to its meager financial resources as well as some other executive difficulties. It was followed by some significant reforms in both college functioning and infrastructure. Further, the growth of the college has been at a phenomenal pace since 2008 with a radical adjustment in a number of courses, faculty, infrastructure and other teaching learning resources. At present, it has become the foremost organization in the area, having 16 PG like M.Com, MCA, M.Sc. (Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, IT, FT) and M.A. with various specializations and 14 UG courses such as B.A., B.Sc. (Medical and Non-medical), B.Com, B.Com. (Hons.), BCA etc. including 05 skill-development vocational and industry oriented courses, 151 faculty members, 4446 students (2042 girls and 2404 boys) with stateof-the-art infrastructure and technology to provide quality education.

It begins with the pre-semester planning that includes sequential steps to explore the resource potential and reach the institutional goals. To materialize this process, **Academic Calendar** is formulated by the IQAC. The Semester Activities begin with the Orientation programme for students followed by an induction course of 5-7 days that bridges the intellectual/cultural gap

There is a plethora of student enrichment activities e.g. seminars, workshops, webinars, expert lectures, industrial trainings, special talks etc. along with many outreach activities like field tours, educational excursions etc. which help the institute to achieve the cognitive development among learners. Post semester activities include collection and documentation of student feedback and submission of internal assessment. The following strategies are followed to ensure the effective curriculum planning and implementation:

- At the beginning of the academic session, IQAC, HODs and Academic Council of the College prepare the Academic Calendar in coordination with affiliating university academic calendar for smooth conduct of the session.
- All the departments hold meetings before the commencement of session to plan for
  the effective implementation of the curriculums as per the schedule, described in the
  Academic calendar. Further systematic allotment of the subject papers is made to the
  faculty based on their areas of specialization and interest by the HODs through
  discussions in departmental meetings for the upcoming semester.
- Course files are made mandatory for the faculty and are periodically checked by the
  HODs to see the linkage and mapping between the program objectives and outcomes.
  Periodic review meetings are conducted by the HODs to discuss the coverage of the
  syllabus and solutions to the lacunae if any.
- The college has enough state-of-the-art infrastructures to meet the current requirements in the best possible way for effective and substantial implementation of the curricula. The class rooms have ICT facilitated labs which are well-equipped with all equipments and apparatus to meet the requirements of the curricula.
- The college library is well-stocked with all relevant print and electronic resources including text books, reference books and scholarly journals, catering to the different requirements of the students and teachers.
- Regular class tests, internal evaluation, assignments, seminars etc. are held for the
  internal assessment of the students as per the schedule given in academic calendar.
  The external theory and practical examinations are conducted by the patron university
  as per schedule.
- Special remedial classes, boost up classes, seminars, conferences, seminars, expert lectures, workshops etc. are continuously organized by the departments for the effective curriculum delivery and to enhance the knowledge and skills of students.

## Focus Area III: Teaching-Learning process

The ICT enabled learning environment of the institution is conducive in developing creative and critical thinking as well as a scientific temper among the students. The students' learning experiences have been enhanced with the use of ICT tools during

The college library provides access to a plethora of E-resources. The college has put all its efforts to provide the following ICT infrastructure to make it happen:

- Projectors 38 projectors are available in various classrooms/labs
- Desktop 317 desktops located in computer labs and faculty rooms throughout campus.
- **Printers** 32 printers are installed in labs, HOD booths and all prominent places.
- Seminar rooms Three seminar rooms are equipped with all digital facilities.
- Smart Board 7 Smart Boards are installed on campus.
- Portable Projectors Portable projectors available on campus
- Wi-Fiaccesspoint- 42 Wi-Fi access points are available on campus
- Video Meeting Tools-Online courses via Zoom, Google Meet, Microsoft Team, GoogleClassroom

Use of ICT by Faculty-

- Faculties are encouraged to use power-point presentations in their teaching by using LCD's and projectors.
- Seminar and Conference room are digitally equipped where guest lectures, expert talks and various competitions are regularly organized for students.
- Students are counseled with the help of Zoom / Google meet applications.
- Recording of video lectures is made available to students for long term learning and future referencing.

Teachers have prepared their own YouTube channels and uploaded their lectures and shared thier lecture links with students to impart knowledge and learn. Regular classes are held via Zoom and Google Classrooms. WhatsApp groups, with a strong presence of teachers and students have became an amazing platform for sharing ideas, thoughts, counselling sessions and celebrations. These groups keep teachers and students in high spirits around the clock. Regular workshops are conducted by the college administration for the faculty and students to provide training for the use of ICT.
